^{*} Generally, extremely low-income families are defined to be very low-income families whose incomes are the greater of the Poverty Guidelines as published and periodically updated by the Department of Health and Human Services or the 30 percent income limits calculated by HUD. However, Puerto Rico and other territories are specifically excluded from this adjustment. Instead, in Puerto Rico the Extremely Low Income Limit is set at the Very Low Income Limit.
